Know Christ & Make Him Known Lesson 7: "Money, Job, & Possessions" (TC)

<u>Matthew 6:19-21</u> -"Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: (20) But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: (21) For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

<u>Colossians 3:23</u> - "And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men;" <u>Psalm 24:1</u> - "The earth is the LORD'S, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein."

<u>Malachi 3:10</u> - "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the LORD of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."

Does the Bible say anything about money, jobs and possessions? Yes. The Bible contains more than 2,350 verses dealing with <u>money</u> and <u>possessions</u>. 11 of 39 parables talk about money. 1 out of every 7 verses in the Gospel of Luke talks about <u>money</u>. Jesus talked about <u>money</u> more than He did <u>Heaven</u> and <u>Hell</u> combined, and more than anything else, except the Kingdom of God. Consider the impact money, jobs and possessions have in our lives:

- They are an influence on most of the decisions we make.
- They impact us on a daily basis.
- They influence our walk with Christ.
- They are a primary competitor with Christ for the Lordship of our lives.

What does the Bible teach regarding our money, job, and possessions?

- I. **Ownership**: God owns everything! (Psalm 24:1)
 - a. God is the Creator of all things. (Exodus 20:11, John 1:1-3)
 - b. God is the Owner of all things. (Psalm 24:1)
 - c. God owns believers <u>twice</u>; He created us and redeemed us with the price of His Son Jesus Christ. (I Cor. 6:19-20)
- II. Responsibility / Stewardship: We are called to be stewards of all that we have, knowing it doesn't belong to us. (I Cor. 4:1-2)
 - a. We are stewards of our time. (Proverbs 27:1; James 4:14)
 - b. We are stewards of our talents. (James 1:17; Romans 12:6)
 - c. We are stewards of our treasures (money and possessions). (Haggai 2:8)
 - d. We are stewards of our trades (occupations and careers). (Ps. 75:6-7)
 - e. We are stewards of our temples (lives, families and children). (I Cor. 6:20; Psalm 127:3)
 - f. We are stewards of everything we could claim to be ours! (I Cor. 7:23; Acts 20:28)
 - g. Results from wise stewardship:
 - i. Honoring God, in turn God honors you. (Proverbs 3:9)
 - ii. God's house (the local Church) is <u>provided</u> for, we will be blessed, Satan rebuked, and the fruit of our labor is protected. (Malachi 3:10-12)
 - iii. The fulfillment of the Great Commission. (Matthew 28:18-20)
 - iv. The fulfillment of the Great Commandments. (Matthew 22:36-40)
- III. <u>Accountability</u>: We must give an <u>account</u> of what we have done with what God has entrusted to us! (II Corinthians 5:10)

- a. All believers will stand before <u>Christ</u> in judgment according to their works, whether good or bad. (II Cor. 5:10)
- b. All believers will be tried, but not for salvation. Jesus Christ took this judgment on the Cross of Calvary! (II Corinthians 5:21)
- c. Rewards will be handed out according to our works. (I Cor. 3:11-15; Rom. 8:31)
- d. These rewards will be cast back before Christ. (Rev. 4:10-11)
- IV. <u>Tithing</u>: Returning to God what He requires. (Malachi 3:8-10)
 - a. A person doesn't give their tithes, they return them.
 - b. Tithe: means tenth or 10% of all we receive.
 - c. Tithes are to be brought to God's storehouse. The Old Testament storehouse was the Tabernacle, then the Temple. In the New Testament it is the local church. (I Cor. 16:1-2)
 - d. The tithes are to be brought on Sunday, the Lord's Day. (I Corinthians 16:1-2)
 - e. Were tithes only to be given under the law?
 - i. Abraham gave the tithe before the Law. Gen. 14:20 "...And he gave him tithes of all."
 - ii. Jacob gave the tithe before the Law. Gen. 28:22 "And this stone, which I have set for a pillar, shall be God's house: and of all that thou shalt give me I will surely give the tenth unto thee."
 - iii. God commanded the tithe from those <u>under</u> the Law. Leviticus 27:30 "The tithe... is the Lord's: it is holy unto the Lord."
 - iv. It was also after the Law had been broken. (Malachi 3:8-10)
 - v. Jesus confirmed it in Matthew 23:23 that the Pharisees and scribes should not have neglected to give the tithe and offering; "these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone."
- V. <u>Offerings:</u> Giving <u>above</u> and <u>beyond</u> what is required. (Luke 6:38)
 - a. Offerings are over and above the tithe or the first 10%.
 - b. Offerings are to be brought to God's storehouse, the local church.
 - c. Biblical <u>offerings</u> were given for building needs, missions work, aid for the poor, and other needs as God and His Word directed. (Exodus 35:4-5, 21; 36:6-7; I Chronicles 22 & 29; II Corinthians 90:1-5; Philippians 4:14-19; Acts 11:27-30)
 - d. Offerings should be given <u>willingly</u> (Exodus 35:5, 21), <u>sacrificially</u> (Mark 12:41-44), and <u>cheerfully</u> (II Corinthians 9:7).
- VI. <u>Contentment:</u> Life's not about what we have, but Whose we are and where we are going! (Matthew 6:33)
 - a. Contentment is being satisfied with God's provision. (I Timothy 6:8)
 - b. Spurgeon: "Contentment is not getting what you want, but wanting what you have."
 - c. Discontentment with our position in life is <u>dissatisfaction</u> in God's provision. (Philippians 4:11)
 - d. Godliness with contentment should be the goal. (I Timothy 6:6)
 - e. A desire to be rich brings snares and heartache. (I Timothy 6:9)
 - f. Having money isn't wrong, money having us is. (I Timothy 6:10)
 - g. Naked was I born, naked shall I return. (Job 1:21; I Timothy 6:7)
 - h. Question: How do you know if you have an unhealthy affection towards money? Consider the following areas and the way you use these to attain more money: Time, talents, treasure, and your temple (body). Is Christ or covetousness first in these areas?
